Corona Response

In the midst of the raging COVID-19 pandemic and many strict lockdowns in Israel, the ICEJ was able to provide assistance to many different communities because of partners like you! Below are some of the highlights of our corona response efforts:

- Served 55,440 meals to elderly people and needy families in the greater Jerusalem area.
- Gave out 19,515 hygiene kits and medical supplies to elderly people, Holocaust Survivors, and emergency response teams at the Gaza border.
- Distributed 2,851 emergency and Passover food baskets to Holocaust Survivors, single parent families, and other disadvantaged families.
- Provided 483 gift cards to new immigrants and single parent families.
- Purchased 109 computers for immigrant students and disadvantaged families for distance learning due to the lockdown.

Home for Holocaust Survivors

When the coronavirus hit Israel, Holocaust Survivors were suddenly in complete isolation. The ICEJ aid team had to change the way they took care of the residents of the Haifa Home of Holocaust Survivors. In 2020 we:

- Moved a team of ICEJ staff into the Home to isolate along with the Survivors in order to visit every resident daily, bring them three meals per day, and monitor their health.
- Opened a new activity center in the midst of the coronavirus shut down. This activity center was used by small groups practicing social distancing to celebrate birthdays and, in the fall, to celebrate Rosh Hashanah.
- Received 635 letters from donors who had adopted Survivors. This had such an impact on the residents in the midst of the shutdown and one Survivor named Mania said, "do people send letters even now? It touches me so deeply that they are thinking of me and remember me and go to all this trouble of writing me this beautiful letter."



- A mentoring program where we helped 55 families to find suitable employment, assisted with financial needs, and helped new immigrants integrate into life in Israel.
- Vocational training and recertification programs helped
 107 immigrants.
- Educational enrichment, social and cultural assistance was provided for 40 immigrant kids.
- Afterschool programs and academic assistance for Ethiopian youth immigrants impacted a number of Ethiopian immigrant students struggling to keep up with their Israeli counterparts and in danger of falling behind.

In March, of 2020 we started our weekly Global Prayer Call from Jerusalem that broadcasted over the entire world and thousands of Christians joined us in prayer for Israel, the nations and the pandemic.

In September, we began broadcasting podcasts and videos to reach a new generation with ICEJ teachings on new platforms.

In November, the ICEJ's network of American Christian Leaders for Israel (ACLI) organized a 4-part webinar series to start a dialogue regarding the growth of anti-Semitism in the USA and around the world. Over 400 American pastors and Christian leaders joined us for this impactful dialogue.
